Updates from the Lay Directors

After careful review of an August 2020 guidance document from the Diocese of Corpus Christi (DoCC), the Board of Directors has approved for 2021 Teams to resume planning meetings in person, should they so choose, but with the understanding that they must exercise COVID-19 safeguards including social distancing, masks, sanitizers, temperature checks, etc., as is detailed in guidance issued by the Center for Disease Control (CDC), State & local authorities, and the guidelines from the Diocese of Corpus Christi (DoCC). As an alternative to in person

meetings, the Teams can also elect to meet via electronic social platforms including Facetime, Microsoft Teams, Zoom, Webex, etc. Keep in mind though, that as of the August 2020 guidance from the DoCC, overnight stays are currently not permitted, which means that this DoCC guideline will need to be lifted in order to permit Journey weekends to occur. Hopefully later this year or even early in 2021, we are hopeful for a change to allow it. As we move toward 2021 with the anticipation of resuming Journey Weekends, the JTD Board will continue working to develop additional guidelines as new directives are received from the CDC and DoCC. In the meantime, please keep our community in your prayers especially for the end of this pandemic.

Some Words from the Wise

Brought to you this month by Rev. Ceil C. McKinney

To my Fourth Day Community:

For we are God's handiwork, created in Christ Jesus to do good works, which God prepared in advance for us to do. (Ephesians 2:10 NIV)

"Teacher, which is the greatest commandment in the Law?" Jesus replied: "Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind.' This is the first and greatest commandment. And the second is like it: 'Love your neighbor as yourself.' All the Law and the Prophets hang on these two commandments.'" (Matthew 22:36-40)

My husband and I live at a Senior Residential Facility. We have been locked down since February. Until a few weeks ago that meant NO ONE LEFT THE GROUNDS OF THE PROPERTY. If you did several things could happen. At first we would have to stay with family or in a motel. Later it was changed to being quarantined for 14 days in your apartment. Now things are looser still, with masks and gloves, we can go get gas for our cars, go to the doctors – some 'non-essential' treatments become

essential after 8 months, and we are allowed to go to the drive through window of eating establishments. And with a mask and social distancing we are allowed to socialize with our friends who live in other apartments. It has been difficult, 24 hours a day, even with the love of my life, has proved stressful. Then I realized that I serve God by loving and caring for Joe. So loving Joe became an offering to God during those times when neither of us were very lovable or loving.

Out of this forced mindfulness our Viera community has discovered several ways to minister to those who have a need we can supply. The daughter of a resident teaches at a State Prison. She discovered that women being released from prison have only the clothes on their backs when they leave. The Chaplain began giving each parolee several sets of clothing to work, interview and begin their new lives. We have been able to clear out our closets and provide clothes for these women. We also have plans to 'adopt' two families through the Salvation Army for a Thanksgiving Feast. Both of these actions have given us a sense of being A PART OF rather than being APART FROM people outside our property.

Look back over the last 8 months what ministries have deepened your walk with Christ. Have you begun to study scripture, or prayed at a different time? Maybe you helped your children with their studies? Perhaps you mowed an elderly neighbor's lawn? You became much more dedicated to attending reunion group meetings online. You get the idea. All actions for which God calls you are ministries. Salvation is not earned by doing good works...good works come out of being saved by Jesus Christ's sacrifice.

November 2020 we have an election. (I know you are all surprised by this news!) We are guided by God, each person individually, to vote as directed by the ballot for that person or persons God tells us to vote for. Your guidance is no more or less valid than my guidance even if we vote for different people. Each side says the other one will destroy our nation. 'Me thinks' that they leave God out entirely. Our nation will cease to exist not by the works of man, but by the love of God who has better plans for us.

"Perseverance is continuing to do something in the face of difficulty – to preserve in the life of grace." (2019 JTD Spiritual Director's manual, p71.) We have been persevering for 8 months and will continue for as long as we are guided to do so. Look around see how you can FIRST LOVE GOD, then LOVE YOUR NEIGHBOR, FAMILY MEMBERS, or FRIENDS in such a way that God recognizes your loving actions.
